The Eastern Church became known as "Orthodox".


However, both claim to be the "true" Church as the successors to Jesus Christ and the Apostles.

Proto-orthodoxy

"Apostolic Fathers" (Post-Acts)

Insisted Bishops be treated as equal to the Lord

Hierarchy in the "church" (ekklesia)

"Universal church" under one authority

Rewrote history to validate their biblical views

Eliminated all opposing views as "heresy"

Accepted only what they believed as being "orthodox"

Enforced their "orthodoxy" by torture and death.

Orthodox adj.

Conforming to what is generally and traditionally accepted as correct or true; established and approved

Orthodoxy n.

authorized or generally accepted theory, doctrine, or practice.



Although the word "orthodox" is not found in the Scriptures, the idea certainly runs throughout.



Gal 2:14 Orthodox

But when I saw that they walked not uprightly according to the truth of the gospel, I said unto Peter before them all, If thou, being a Jew, livest after the manner of Gentiles, and not as do the Jews, why compellest thou the Gentiles to live as do the Jews? Orthopedeo

2 Timothy 2:15 Orthodox

Study to shew thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth

Orthotomeo = straight cut

Pro 3:5-6

Trust in the LORD with all thine heart And lean not on thine only understanding In all thy ways acknowledge Him And he shall direct (yashar) thy paths.

Rightly divide

Heb 12:13 Orthodox

And make straight paths for your feet, lest that which is lame be turned out of the way; but let it rather be healed.

1 Tim 2:3-4 Orthodox

For this is good and acceptable in the sight of God our Saviour, Who desires all men should be saved and come unto the full knowledge of the truth. (or true knowledge)

Godliness: eusebia

eusebia: well worship

(up)right worship

Orthodox: conforming to

"what is regarded as true or correct,"

"the right opinion,"

"the right thinking"

"revealed truth in the Scriptures"

It seems like the worldly and religious orthodox meaning of

"orthodox"

is actually

"unorthodox"

according to the Greek meaning of the word.

Orthodox

Seems to be another word

that the evil one has

hijacked and perverted

a long time ago.

These early churches were good at pointing out the mote in each others' eye,

But the failed to see the plank in their own eye:

Religion

The idea of "religion" (to bind again) is "unorthodox" to John 8:32, 36.

If ye continue in my word, *then* are ye my disciples indeed; and ye shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free

If the Son therefore shall make you free, ye shall be free indeed.

How can a religion be "orthodox"?

2 Tim 2:24-26

And the servant of the Lord must not strive; but be gentle unto all *men*, apt to teach, patient, ²⁵ in meekness instructing those that oppose themselves; if God peradventure will give them repentance to the acknowledging of the truth; ²⁶ and *that* they may recover themselves out of the snare of the devil, who are taken captive by him at his will.

2 Tim 3:5

having a form of godliness, but denying the power thereof: from such turn away.

2 Tim 3:7

ever learning, and never able to come to the knowledge of the truth.

2 Tim 4:3-4

For the time will come when they will not endure sound doctrine; but after their own lusts shall they heap to themselves teachers, having itching ears; ⁴ and they shall turn away their ears from the truth, and shall be turned unto fables.

"Orthodox" is one of man's words

"Orthodox" is not an inspired word of God

"Orthodox" is another word used in "THE LIE".

How can man be set free in Christ

Then turn around and create a "religion" and a "creed"

And claim to be "Orthodox"

Is that correct in thinking?

It seems (dokeo) to me

that the word "Orthodox" means

the opposite of how it has been used.

Orthodox means right thinking about revealed truth in the Scriptures.

Unorthodox means that which is contrary to the correct understanding of Scripture.

Was Jesus Christ considered orthodox?

Was Paul considered orthodox?

Is our understanding of the Body of Christ considered orthodox?

Jesus was the "orthodox" Judean.

The Pharisees and Sadducees were the unorthodox ones.

Paul became the "orthodox" apostle.

The Judeans were the unorthodox ones.

Actually the

GREAT SCHISM

occurred

AT THE END OF THE ACTS

When the "Judeo-Christians" took the path of religion that departed from

Paul's revelation of the Mystery

This thou knowest, that all they which are in Asia be turned away from me. (2 Tim 1:15)

They were not given the spirit of wisdom and revelation in the acknowledging of Him (Eph 1:17)

The eyes of their understanding were not enlightened (Eph 1:18)

They were not strengthened with might by His Spirit in the inner man. (Eph 3:16)

They were not filled with the knowledge of His will in all wisdom and spiritual understanding. (Co 1:9)

Is not the understanding of the dispensation of the Body of Christ actually

The Body of Christ


is the present and mature
