The Apostle Paul and Timothy: Coaching / Mentoring 101

Introduction:

Question:

"Are we preparing the next generation to speak Boldly? And about What?"

2 Tim 4:4-8

⁴And they shall turn away *their* ears from the truth, and shall be turned unto fables.

⁵But watch thou in all things, endure afflictions, do the work of an evangelist, make full proof of thy ministry. ⁶For I am now ready to be offered, and the time of my departure is at hand.

⁷I have fought a good fight, I have finished *my* course, I have kept the faith: ⁸Henceforth there is laid up for me a crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous judge, shall give me at that day: and not to me only, but unto all them also that love his appearing.

Col 1:25-27

Whereof I am made a minister, according to the dispensation of God which is given to me for you, to fulfil the word of God;

²⁶*Even* the mystery which hath been hid from ages and from generations, but now is made manifest to his saints:

²⁷To whom God would make known what *is* the riches of the glory of this mystery among the Gentiles; which is Christ in you, the hope of glory:

Eph 3:7-12

⁷Whereof I was made a minister, according to the gift of the grace of God given unto me by the effectual working of his power. ⁸Unto me, who am less than the least of all saints, is this grace given, that I should preach among the Gentiles the unsearchable riches of Christ; ⁹And to make all *men* see what *is* the fellowship of the mystery, which from the beginning of the world hath been hid in God, who created all things by Jesus Christ: ¹⁰To the intent that now unto the principalities and powers in heavenly *places* might be known by the church the manifold wisdom of God, ¹¹According to the eternal purpose which he purposed in Christ Jesus our Lord: ¹²In whom we have boldness and access with confidence by the faith of him.

Question:

"What do we learn from Paul's writings to his protégé Timothy, that we can use to help the next generation?"

1 Timothy 1:1-6

¹Paul, an apostle of Jesus Christ by the commandment of God our Saviour, and Lord Jesus Christ, *which is* our hope; ²Unto Timothy, *my* own son in the faith: Grace, mercy, *and* peace, from God our Father and Jesus Christ our Lord. ³As I besought thee to abide still at Ephesus, when I went into Macedonia, that thou mightest charge some that they teach no other doctrine, ⁴Neither give heed to fables and endless genealogies, which minister questions, rather than godly **edifying** which is in faith: *so do*. ⁵Now the end of the commandment is charity out of a pure heart, and *of* a good conscience, and *of* faith unfeigned: ⁶From which some having swerved have turned aside unto vain jangling;

G3618 - oikodomeō - to *be* a *house builder*, that is, *construct* or (figuratively) *confirm:*—(be in) build (-er, -ing, up), **edify**, embolden.

Eph 4:12-15 For the perfecting of the saints, for the work of the ministry, for the **edifying** of the body of Christ: ¹³Till we all come in the unity of the faith, and of the knowledge of the Son of God, unto a perfect man, unto the measure of the stature of the fulness of Christ: ¹⁴That we *henceforth* be no more children, tossed to and fro, and carried about with every wind of doctrine, by the sleight of men, *and* cunning craftiness, whereby they lie in wait to deceive; ¹⁵But speaking the truth in love, may **grow up into him** in all things, which is the head, *even* Christ:

Eph 4:29 Let no corrupt communication proceed out of your mouth, but that which is good to the use of **edifying**, that it may minister grace unto the hearers. ³⁰And grieve not the holy Spirit of God, whereby ye are sealed unto the day of redemption. ³¹Let all bitterness, and wrath, and anger, and clamour, and evil speaking, be put away from you, with all malice: ³²And be ye kind one to another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, even as God for Christ's sake hath forgiven you.

<u>1 Tim 4:6-16</u>

⁶If thou put the brethren in remembrance of these things, thou shalt be a good minister of Jesus Christ, **nourished up in the words of faith** and of good doctrine, whereunto thou hast attained. ⁷But refuse profane and old wives' fables, and exercise thyself *rather* unto godliness. ⁸For bodily exercise profiteth little: but godliness is profitable unto all things, having promise of the life that now is, and of that which is to come.

Exercise: <u>g1128</u> gymnazō goom-nas-ee'-ah; from <u>G1128</u>; training, i.e. (figuratively) asceticism:—exercise.

⁹This *is* a faithful saying and worthy of all acceptation. ¹⁰For therefore we both labour and suffer reproach, because we **trust in the living God**, who is the Saviour of all men, specially of those that believe. ¹¹These things command and teach. ¹²Let no man despise thy youth; but **be thou an example of the believers, in word, in conversation, in charity, in spirit, in faith, in purity.**

¹³Till I come, give attendance to reading, to exhortation, to doctrine. ¹⁴Neglect not the gift that is in thee, which was given thee by prophecy, with the laying on of the hands of the presbytery. ¹⁵Meditate upon these things; give thyself wholly to them; that thy profiting may appear to all. ¹⁶Take heed unto thyself, and unto the doctrine; continue in them: for in doing this thou shalt both save thyself, and them that hear thee.

G1249- diakonos - (to *run* on errands; compare <u>G1377</u>); an *attendant*, that is, (generally) a *waiter* (at table or in other menial duties); specifically a Christian *teacher* and *pastor* (technically a *deacon* or *deaconess*):— deacon, minister, servant.

Philippians 2:1-8

If *there be* therefore any consolation in Christ, if any comfort of love, if any fellowship of the Spirit, if any bowels and mercies, ²Fulfil ye my joy, that ye be likeminded, having the same love, *being* of one accord, of one mind. ³Let nothing *be done* through strife or vainglory; but in lowliness of mind let each <u>esteem</u> other better than themselves. ⁴Look not every man on his own things, but every man also on the things of others.

Vs 5 - Let this mind be in you, which was also in Christ Jesus: ⁶Who, being in the form of God, thought it not robbery to be equal with God: ⁷But made himself of no reputation, and took upon him the form of a servant, and was made in the likeness of men: ⁸And being found in fashion as a man, he humbled himself, and became obedient unto death, even the death of the cross.

G2233 - hēgeomai - Middle voice of a (presumed) strengthened form of <u>G71</u>; to *lead*, that is, *command* (with official authority); figuratively to *deem*, that is, *consider:*—account, (be) chief, count, **esteem**, governor, **judge**, have the rule over, suppose, **think**.

<u>1 Tim 6:6</u> Godliness with contentment is great gain. ⁷For we brought nothing into *this* world, *and it is* certain we can carry nothing out. <u>Vs 11:</u> But thou, O man of God, flee these things; and follow after righteousness, godliness, faith, love, patience, meekness. ¹²Fight the good fight of faith, lay hold on eternal life, whereunto thou art also called, and hast professed a good profession before many witnesses. ¹³I give thee charge in the sight of God, who quickeneth all things, and *before* Christ Jesus, who before Pontius Pilate witnessed a good confession; ¹⁴That thou keep *this* commandment without spot, unrebukeable, until the appearing of our Lord Jesus Christ:

<u>Vs 20:</u> O Timothy, **keep that which is committed to thy trust**, avoiding profane *and* vain babblings, and oppositions of science falsely so called: ²¹Which some professing have erred concerning the faith. Grace *be* with thee. Amen.

2 Timothy 1:1-3

Paul, an apostle of Jesus Christ by the will of God, according to the promise of life which is in Christ Jesus, ²To Timothy, *my* dearly beloved son: Grace, mercy, *and* peace, from God the Father and Christ Jesus our Lord. ³I thank God, whom I serve from *my* forefathers with pure conscience, that without ceasing I have remembrance of thee in my prayers night and day;

Vs 7 -For God hath not given us the spirit of fear; but of power, and of love, and of a sound mind. ***Be not thou therefore ashamed of the testimony of our Lord**, nor of me his prisoner: but be thou partaker of the afflictions of the gospel according to the power of God;

¹¹Whereunto I am appointed a preacher, and an apostle, and a teacher of the Gentiles. ¹²For the which cause I also suffer these things: nevertheless I am not ashamed: for I know whom I have believed, and am persuaded that he is able to keep that which I have committed unto him against that day. ¹³Hold fast the form of sound words, which thou hast heard of me, in faith and love which is in Christ Jesus. ¹⁴That good thing which was committed unto thee keep by the Holy Ghost which dwelleth in us.

2 Timothy 2:1-2

¹Thou therefore, my son, **be strong** in the grace that is in Christ Jesus. ²And the things that thou hast heard of me among many witnesses, the same **commit thou to faithful men**, who shall be able to teach others also.

Vs 5 - And if a man also strive for masteries, *yet* is he not crowned, except he strive lawfully.

Vs 14 - Of these things **put** *them* **in remembrance**, **charging** *them* before the Lord that they strive not about words to no profit, *but* to the subverting of the hearers.

2 Timothy 2:15-18

Study to show thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth. ¹⁶But shun profane *and* vain babblings: for they will increase unto more ungodliness. ¹⁷And their word will eat as doth a canker: of whom is Hymenaeus and Philetus; ¹⁸Who concerning the truth have erred.....and overthrow the faith of some.

2 Timothy 2:24-26

²⁴And the servant of the Lord must not strive; but **be gentle unto all** *men*, **apt to teach, patient**, ²⁵In meekness instructing those that oppose themselves; if God peradventure will give them repentance to the acknowledging of the truth; ²⁶And *that* they may recover themselves out of the snare of the devil, who are taken captive by him at his will.

2 Timothy 3:10-17

¹⁰But thou hast fully known my doctrine, manner of life, purpose, faith, longsuffering, charity, patience, ¹¹Persecutions, afflictions, **Vs 14-** But **continue** thou in the things which thou hast learned and hast been assured of, knowing of whom thou hast learned *them*; ¹⁵And that from a child thou hast known the holy scriptures, which are able to make

thee wise unto salvation through faith which is in Christ Jesus. ¹⁶All scripture *is* given by inspiration of God, and *is* profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness: ¹⁷That the man of God may be perfect (fulfilled or complete), thoroughly furnished unto all good works.

Colossians 2:8-10

Beware lest any man spoil you through philosophy and vain deceit, after the tradition of men, after the rudiments of the world, and not after Christ. ⁹For in him dwelleth all the fulness of the Godhead bodily. ¹⁰And ye are **complete** (Greek-filled up) in him, which is the head of all principality and power:

G4138 - plērōma - *repletion* or *completion*, that is, (subjectively) what *fills* (as contents, supplement, copiousness, multitude), or (objectively) what is *filled* (as container, performance, period):—which is put in to fill up, piece that **filled** up, fulfilling, full, fulness.

2 Timothy 4:1-8

I charge *thee* therefore before God, and the Lord Jesus Christ, who shall judge the quick and the dead at his appearing and his kingdom; ²**Preach** the word; be instant in season, out of season; **reprove, rebuke, exhort** with all longsuffering and doctrine. ³For the time will come when they will not endure sound doctrine; but after their own lusts shall they heap to themselves teachers, having itching ears; ⁴And they shall turn away *their* ears from the truth, and shall be turned unto fables. ⁵But watch thou in all things, **endure afflictions, do the work of an evangelist, make full proof of thy ministry**. ⁶For I am now ready to be offered, and the time of my departure is at hand. ⁷I have fought a good fight, I have finished *my* **course, I have kept the faith**: ⁸Henceforth there is laid up for me a crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous judge, shall give me at that day: and not to me only, but unto all them also that **love his appearing**.
