FREE - Freedom

John 8:31 Then said Jesus to those Jews which believed on him, if ye continue in my word, *then* are ye my disciples indeed; ³²And ye shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you **free**. ³³They answered him, we be Abraham's seed, and were never in bondage to any man: how say thou, Ye shall be made **free**? ³⁴Jesus answered them, Verily, verily, I say unto you, whosoever commits sin is the servant of sin. ³⁵And the servant abides not in the house for ever: *but* the Son abides ever. ³⁶If the Son therefore shall make you **free**, ye shall be **free** indeed. ³⁷I know that ye are Abraham's seed; but ye seek to kill me, because my word hath no place in you.

G1659 - eleutheroō -From <u>G1658</u>; to *liberate*, that is, (figuratively) to *exempt* (from moral, ceremonial or mortal liability):—deliver, **make free**.

Freedom

Lev 19:20 And whosoever lies carnally with a woman, that *is* a bondmaid, betrothed to a husband, and not at all redeemed, nor **freedom** given her; she shall be scourged; they shall not be put to death, because she was not **free**. ²¹And he shall bring his trespass offering unto the LORD, unto the door of the tabernacle of the congregation, *even* a ram for a trespass offering. ²²And the priest shall make an atonement for him with the ram of the trespass offering before the LORD for his sin which he hath done: and the sin which he hath done shall be forgiven him.

H2668 - chûphshâh - *liberty* (from slavery):—freedom.

Acts 22:28 Then the chief captain came, and said unto him, tell me, art thou a Roman? He said, Yea. ²⁸And the chief captain answered, with a great sum obtained I this **freedom**. And Paul said, but I was **free** born. ²⁹Then straightway they departed from him which should have examined him: and the chief captain also was afraid, after he knew that he was a Roman, and because he had bound him. ³

G4174 – politeia -("polity"); *citizenship*; concretely a *community:*— commonwealth, freedom.

G859 - aphesis - *freedom*; (figuratively) *pardon:*—deliverance, forgiveness, liberty, remission.

G1657 – from 1658 - eleutheria - *freedom* (legitimate or licentious, chiefly moral or ceremonial):—liberty.

G1658 – eleutheros - *unrestrained* (to *go* at pleasure), that is, (as a citizen) *not a slave* (whether *freeborn* or *manumitted*), or

(generally) *exempt* (from obligation or liability):—**free** (man, woman), at liberty.

FREE

Ps 51:9-12 Hide thy face from my sins, and blot out all mine iniquities.

10 Create in me a clean heart, O God; and renew a right spirit within me.

11 Cast me not away from thy presence; and take not thy holy spirit from me.

12 Restore unto me the joy of thy salvation; and uphold me with thy free spirit.

H5081 - nâdîyb - properly *voluntary*, that is, generous; hence, *magnanimous*; as noun, a *grandee* (sometimes a *tyrant*):—free, liberal (things), noble, prince, willing ([hearted]).

<u>Isaiah 58:6</u> *Is* not this the fast that I have chosen? to loose the bands of wickedness, to undo the heavy burdens, and to let the oppressed go <u>free</u>, and that ye break every yoke?

H2670 - chophshîy - (from bondage, tax or care):—free, liberty.

Rom 5:12 Wherefore, as by one man sin entered into the world, and death by sin; and so death passed upon all men, for that all have sinned: 13(For until the law sin was in the world: but sin is not imputed when there is no law. ¹⁴Nevertheless death reigned from Adam to Moses, even over them that had not sinned after the similitude of Adam's transgression, who is the figure of him that was to come. ¹⁵But not as the offence, so also *is* the **free** gift. For if through the offence of one many be dead, much more the grace of God, and the gift by grace, which is by one man, Jesus Christ, hath abounded unto many. 16 And not as it was by one that sinned, so is the gift: for the judgment was by one to condemnation but the **free** gift is of many offences unto justification. ¹⁷For if by one man's offence death reigned by one; much more they which receive abundance of grace and of the gift of righteousness shall reign in life by one, Jesus Christ.) ¹⁸Therefore as by the offence of one judgment came upon all men to condemnation; even so by the righteousness of one the free gift came upon all men unto justification of life. ¹⁹For as by one man's disobedience many were made sinners, so by the obedience of one shall many be made righteous.

G5486 – charisma -From <u>G5483</u>; a (divine) *gratuity*, that is, *deliverance* (from danger or passion); (specifically) a (spiritual) *endowment*, that is, (subjectively) religious *qualification*, or (objectively) miraculous *faculty:*— (**free**) gift.

<u>Rom 6:18-23</u> Being then made **free** from sin, ye became the servants of righteousness. ¹⁹I speak after the manner of men because of the infirmity of your flesh: for as ye have yielded your members servants to uncleanness and to iniquity unto iniquity; even so now yield your members servants to righteousness unto holiness. ²⁰For when ye were the servants of sin, ye

were **free** from righteousness. ²¹What fruit had ye then in those things whereof ye are now ashamed? for the end of those things *is* death. ²²But now being made **free** from sin, and become servants to God, ye have your fruit unto holiness, and the end everlasting life. ²³For the wages of sin *is* death; but the gift of God *is* eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord.

G1659 - eleutheroō -From <u>G1658</u>; to *liberate*, that is, (figuratively) to *exempt* (from moral, ceremonial or mortal liability):—deliver, make free.

<u>1 Cor 12:13</u> For by one Spirit are we all baptized into one body, whether we be Jews or Gentiles, whether we be bond or **free**; and have been all made to drink into one Spirit. **G1658** – eleutheros

Gal 5:1-7 Stand fast therefore in the **liberty** wherewith Christ hath made us **free**, and be not entangled again with the yoke of bondage. ²Behold, I Paul say unto you, that if ye be circumcised, Christ shall profit you nothing. ³For I testify again to every man that is circumcised, that he is a debtor to do the whole law. ⁴Christ is become of no effect unto you, whosoever of you are justified by the law; ye are fallen from grace. ⁵For we through the Spirit wait for the hope of righteousness by faith. ⁶For in Jesus Christ neither circumcision availeth anything, nor uncircumcision; but faith which worketh by love. ⁷Ye did run well; who did hinder you that ye should not obey the truth?

G1657 – eleutheria From <u>G1658</u>; *freedom* (legitimate or licentious, chiefly moral or ceremonial):—liberty. **G1659** - eleutheroō

Acts 13:38-43 Be it known unto you therefore, men *and* brethren, that through this man is preached unto you the forgiveness of sins: ³⁹And by him all that believe are <u>justified (free)</u> from all things, from which ye could not be justified (free) by the law of Moses. ⁴⁰Beware therefore, lest that come upon you, which is spoken of in the prophets; ⁴¹Behold, ye despisers, and wonder, and perish: for I work a work in your days, a work which ye shall in no wise believe, though a man declare it unto you.

⁴²And when the Jews were gone out of the synagogue, the Gentiles besought that these words might be preached to them the next sabbath. ⁴³Now when the congregation was broken up, many of the Jews and religious proselytes followed Paul and Barnabas: who, speaking to them, persuaded them to continue in the grace of God.

G1344 - dikaioō - From <u>G1342</u>; to *render* (that is, *show* or *regard* as) *just* or *innocent:*—<u>free</u>, justify (-ier), be righteous.

<u>Rom 3:23-</u>24 For all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God; ²⁴Being **justified** <u>freely</u> by his grace through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus:

G1432 - dōrean - Accusative case of <u>G1431</u> as adverb; *gratuitously* (literally or figuratively):—without a cause, freely, for naught, in vain.

In the Dispensation of Grace, what are we free from?

Eph 2:14-16 For he is our peace, who hath made both one, and hath **broken down** the middle wall of partition *between us*; ¹⁵Having **abolished** in his flesh the enmity, *even* the law of commandments *contained* in ordinances; for to make in himself of twain one new man, *so* making peace; ¹⁶And that he might reconcile both unto God in one body by the cross, having slain the enmity thereby:

Eph 6:8 Knowing that whatsoever good thing any man doeth, the same shall he receive of the Lord, whether *he be* bond or **free**. ⁹And, ye masters, do the same things unto them, forbearing threatening: knowing that your Master also is in heaven; neither is there respect of persons with him.

<u>Col 2:13-15</u> And you, being dead in your sins and the uncircumcision of your flesh, hath he quickened together with him, having forgiven you all trespasses; ¹⁴Blotting out the handwriting of ordinances that was **against** us, which was contrary to us, and took it out of the way, nailing it to his cross; ¹⁵*And* having spoiled principalities and powers, he made a show of them openly, **triumphing** over them in it.

Col 2:19-20 Therefore if ye be dead with Christ from the rudiments of the world, why, as though living in the world, are ye subject to ordinances, ²¹(Touch not; taste not; handle not; ²²Which all are to perish with the using;) after the commandments and doctrines of men? ²³Which things have indeed a show of wisdom in will worship, and humility, and neglecting of the body; not in any honor to the satisfying of the flesh.

<u>Col 3:8-11</u> But now ye also put off all these; anger, wrath, malice, blasphemy, filthy communication out of your mouth. ⁹Lie not one to another, seeing that ye have put off the old man with his deeds; ¹⁰And have put on the new *man*, which is renewed in knowledge after the image of him that created him: ¹¹Where there is neither Greek nor Jew, circumcision nor uncircumcision, Barbarian, Scythian, bond *nor* **free**: but Christ *is* all, and in all.

G1658 – eleutheros - *unrestrained* (to *go* at pleasure), that is, (as a citizen) *not a slave* (whether *freeborn* or *manumitted*), or (generally) *exempt* (from obligation or liability):—**free** (man, woman), at liberty.

<u>1 Tim 3:16</u> And without controversy great is the mystery of godliness: God was manifest in the flesh, justified in the Spirit, seen of angels, preached unto the Gentiles, believed on in the world, received up into glory.

G1344 - dikaioō - From <u>G1342</u>; to *render* (that is, *show* or *regard* as) *just* or *innocent:*—free, justify (-ier), be righteous.

<u>Titus 3:3</u> For we ourselves also were sometimes foolish, disobedient, deceived, serving divers lusts and pleasures, living in malice and envy, hateful, *and* hating one another. ⁴But after that the kindness and love of God our Saviour toward man appeared, ⁵Not by works of righteousness which we have done, but according to his mercy he saved us, by the washing of regeneration, and renewing of the Holy Ghost; ⁶Which he shed on us abundantly through Jesus Christ our Saviour; ⁷That being <u>justified</u> by his grace, we should be made heirs according to the hope of eternal life.
