The Fear of the Lord (God)

<u>Purpose</u>: To determine if the "Fear of God" means we should be afraid and or terrified by a God who could kill us in an instant, or does it mean something else.

Job 28:28 And unto man he said, Behold, **the fear of the Lord**, that [is] wisdom; and to **depart from evil [is] understanding**.

yir'âh, yir-aw'; H3374; fear (also used as infinitive); morally, reverence:—

× dreadful, × exceedingly, **fear**(-fulness).

How is it translated in KJV in other references?

- 1. fear, terror
- 2. awesome or terrifying thing (object causing fear)
- 3. fear (of God), **respect, reverence**, piety
- 4. revered

So, the fear in Job is it Terror or does it equal reverence.

Psalms 2:11 Serve the LORD with fear and rejoice with trembling

Psalms 119:63 I [am] a companion of all [them] that **fear** thee, and of them that keep thy precepts.

H3372 yârê', yaw-ray'; a primitive root; to fear; morally to **revere**; causatively to frighten:—affright, be (make) afraid, dread(-ful), (put in) fear(-ful, -fully, -ing), (be had in) reverence(-end), × see, terrible (act, -ness, thing).

Proverbs 1:7 The fear (H3374) of the LORD [is] the beginning of knowledge: [but] fools despise wisdom and instruction.

<u>Pro 9:10</u>

The **fear** $\frac{H3374}{I}$ of the LORD *is* the beginning of wisdom: and the knowledge of the holy *is* understanding. $\frac{H998}{I}$

<u>Pro 15:33</u>

The **fear** H3374 of the LORD *is* the instruction of wisdom; and before honour *is* humility.

What happens if we don't seek the knowledge of God and fear Him?

Romans 1:21 because, having **known God** they did not glorify [Him] as God, nor gave thanks, but were made vain in their reasonings, and their unintelligent heart was darkened,

Romans 1:22-23 professing to be wise, they were made fools, 23 and changed the glory of the incorruptible God into the likeness of an image of corruptible man, and of fowls, and of quadrupeds, and of reptiles.

So they knew of God but did not revere Him!

Acts 17-18-26 Then certain philosophers of the Epicureans, and of the Stoicks, encountered him. And some said, What will this babbler say? other some, He seemeth to be a setter forth of strange gods: because he preached unto them Jesus, and the resurrection. ¹⁹And they took him, and brought him unto Areopagus, saying, May we know what this new doctrine, whereof thou speakest, *is*?

²⁰For thou bringest certain strange things to our ears: we would know therefore what these things mean. ²¹(For all the Athenians and strangers which were there spent their time in nothing else, but either to tell, or to hear some new thing.)

²²Then Paul stood in the midst of Mars' hill, and said, Ye men of Athens, I perceive that in all things ye are too superstitious. ²³For as I passed by, and beheld your devotions, I found an altar with this inscription, TO THE UNKNOWN GOD. Whom therefore ye ignorantly worship, him declare I unto you. ²⁴God that made the world and all things therein, seeing that he is Lord of heaven and earth, dwelleth not in temples made with hands; ²⁵Neither is worshipped with men's hands, as though he needed any thing, seeing he giveth to all life, and breath, and all things; ²⁶And hath made of one blood all nations of men for to dwell on all the face of the earth, and hath determined the times before appointed, and the bounds of their habitation; ²⁷That they should seek the Lord, if haply they might feel after him, and find him, though he be not far from every one of us: ²⁸For in him we live, and move, and have our being; as certain also of your own poets have said, For we are also his offspring. ²⁹Forasmuch then as we are the offspring of God, we ought not to think that the Godhead is like unto gold, or silver, or stone, graven by art and man's device. ³⁰And the times of this ignorance God winked at; Here again they knew of the Gods, but not thee GOD so Paul called Him the "Unknown GOD"

Ecclesiastes 12:13 Let us hear the conclusion of the whole matter: **Fear God** and keep his commandments: for this [is] the whole [duty] of man.

Ecclesiastes 12:14 For God shall bring every work into judgment, with every secret thing, whether [it be] good, or whether [it be] evil.

So if we fear God and revere Him we will act like it!

2 Corinthians 5:10 For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ; that every one may receive the things [done] in [his] body, according to that he hath done, whether [it be] good or bad.

Ephesians 6:8 Knowing that whatsoever good thing any man doeth, the same shall he receive of the Lord, whether [he be] bond or free.

So if we don't act like we fear God then we will be rewarded accordingly!

Philippians 3:18 (For many walk, of whom I have told you often, and now tell you even weeping, [that they are] the enemies of the cross of Christ:

2 Timothy 2:15 Study to shew thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth.
