The Roman Church Answer

1854 Pope Pious IX issued a bull "Ineffabilis Deus"



We declare, pronounce and define that the Most Blessed Virgin Mary, at the first instance of her conception was preserved immaculate from all stain of original sin, by the singular grace and privilege of the omnipotent God, in virtue of the merits of Jesus Christ, the Saviour of mankind, and that this doctrine was revealed by God, and therefore, must be believed firmly and constantly by all the faithful."

But it didn't happen like when Jesus was conceived.

To her God poured forth special graces at the moment of **her** conception, and thus she was conceived without original sin. The Church celebrates this feast on December 8. It is a holy day of obligation in the United States and Canada, and many other countries. The patroness of the United States of America is the Blessed Virgin under the title of the Immaculate Conception.

They claim that Mary was made sinless Immediately after she was conceived by her mother Anne with Heli her natural father by some miracle of God. Therefore, Mary was born without the sin of Adam. This puts Mary on equality with Jesus.

Rom 3:9 for we have before proved both Jews and Gentiles, that they are all under sin; ¹⁰ as it is written, There is none righteous, no, not one:

Rom 3:23 for all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God;

Rom 5:12 Wherefore, as by one man sin entered into the world, and death by sin; and so death passed upon all men, for that all have sinned:

Answer No. 2

Perhaps the sin of Adam passes down only through the father only and not the mother.


Since Jesus is the only human not to have a natural father, The sin of Adam was **not** passed on to Him through Mary.

But this leaves Mary in the state of sin.

In order to become sinless, Mary had to be sanctified through salvation.

How could Mary become saved before Jesus ws born?

Did Mary follow the mechanics of Romans?

Rom 10:9

⁹ that if thou shalt confess with thy mouth the Lord Jesus, and shalt believe in thine heart that God hath raised Him from the dead, thou shalt be saved.

Rom 10:13

¹³ For whosoever shall call upon the name of the Lord shall be saved.

Consider what we know about the mystery of the Body of Christ

that we should be holy and without blame before Him in love:

The Scriptures do not say that Mary was blessed, chosen, holy and without blame, made accepted in the Beloved before the foundation (overthrow) of the world.

But He could prepare Mary like the Body of Christ that he might present it to himself a glorious body, not having spot, or wrinkle, or any such thing; but that it should be holy and without blemish.

Gabriel: First Evangelist Preached the Good News

³¹ And, behold, thou shalt conceive in thy womb, and bring forth a son, and shalt call His name **JESUS**. ³² He shall be great, and shall be called the **Son of the Highest**: and the Lord God shall give unto Him the **throne of His father David:** ³³ and He shall reign over the house of Jacob for ever; and of **His kingdom** there shall be no end.

35 also that Holy Thing which shall be born of thee shall be called the Son of God.

Mary: The First Believer in Jesus the Christ

34 Then said Mary unto the angel, How shall this be,

³⁸ And Mary said, Behold the handmaid of the Lord; be it unto me according to thy word.

Mary Believed by Faith

When did Mary become sinless?

³⁴Then said Mary unto the angel, How shall this be, seeing I know not a man? ³⁵ And the angel answered and said unto her, **The Holy Ghost shall come upon thee**, and the **power of the Highest shall overshadow thee**: therefore also **that holy thing** which shall be born of thee shall be called the Son of God.

Mary became sinless by the statement 'The Holy Ghost shall come upon thee"

Then Mary conceived when "the Power of the Highest shall overshadow thee".

In the events of Luke 1:26-35 The angel Gabriel delivered to Mary the good news of her favored status with God. Then he announced the good news of Jesus, the coming King of Israel who will occupy the throne of David and that Mary would give birth to the Son of God

By the grace bestowed upon her by God, Mary believed the angel's good news by the obedience of faith. Thereby she became sanctified and sinless. Mary became "holy and without blame" to conceive and give birth to That Holy Thing, The Son of God.

Joseph: The Second to Believe in Christ

Matt 1:23-24

²³ Behold, a virgin shall be with child, and shall bring forth a son, and they shall call his name Emmanuel, which being interpreted is, God with us.

²⁴Then Joseph being raised from sleep **did as the angel of the Lord had bidden him,** and took unto him (Mary) his wife:

Elizabeth: The Third to Believe in Christ

and Elisabeth was filled with the Holy Ghost:

⁴² and she spake out with a loud voice, and said, **Blessed** *art* **thou among women, and blessed** *is* **the fruit of thy womb.**

⁴³ And whence *is* this to me, that **the mother of my Lord** should come to me?

Question No. 2

And, behold, thy cousin Elisabeth, she hath also conceived a son in her old age: and this is the sixth month with her, who was called barren.



How can Mary and Elizabeth be cousins?

There was in the days of Herod, the king of Judæa, a certain priest named Zacharias, of the course of Abia: and his wife was of the daughters of <u>Aaron</u>, and her name was Elisabeth.

Ex 4:14

And the anger of the LORD was kindled against Moses, and he said, Is not Aaron the Levite thy brother?

And in the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent from God unto a city of Galilee, named Nazareth, ²⁷ to a virgin espoused to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David; and the virgin's name was Mary.

Matt 1:18

Now the birth of Jesus Christ was on this wise: When as his mother Mary was espoused to Joseph, before they came together, she was found with child of the Holy Ghost.

Luke 3:23

And Jesus himself began to be about thirty years of age, being (as was supposed) the son of Joseph, which was the son of Heli,

3:31

...which was the son of Nathan, which was the son of David,

3:33

...which was the son of Juda,

Eliizabeth was of the tribe of Levi, Of the daughters of Aaron Who married priests

Mary was a daughter of Heli Who was of the house of David Who was of the tribe of Judah The modern meaning of the word "cousin" is the child of an aunt and uncle.

What is the Biblical meaning of cousin?

Luke 1:36 is the only occurrence of the word "cousin".

Strong's G4773 syngenes

In Ro 16:11 syngenes is translated "kinsman"

In John 18:26 syngenes is translated "kinsman"

In Luke 1:58 syngenes is translated "cousins"

In Luke 1:61 the word "kindred" is the translation for the Greek *syngeneia*

The word "kindred" occurs 28 times in the Bible

Gen 12:1 is quoted by Stephen in Acts 7:3 Now the Lord had said to Abram

- Get thee out of thy country,
- and from thy kindred,
- and from thy father's house and come into the land which I shall shew thee.

Kindred means neither country nor family Kindred means nation.

Kindred is the English translation for the Greek *gyngeneia* Which is the Greek translation for the Hebrew *moledet*

Kindred means of the same nation, a fellow countryman

Abram was of the Semites, the descendants of Shem

Another translation of *syngenes* is kinswoman which is the same as kinsman

A "cousin" in the Bible means kinswoman of the same nation

And not as we mean the word "cousin".

As "cousins"

Mary and Elizabeth

were kinswomen of the same nation

Luke 1:46 And Mary said,

My soul doth magnify the Lord,

- ⁴⁷ and my spirit hath rejoiced in God my Saviour.
- ⁴⁸ For he hath regarded the low estate of his handmaiden: for, behold, from henceforth all generations shall call me blessed.
- ⁴⁹ For he that is mighty hath done to me great things; and holy *is* his name.
- ⁵⁰ And his mercy *is* on them that fear him from generation to generation.
- ⁵¹ He hath shewed strength with his arm; he hath scattered the proud in the imagination of their hearts.
- ⁵² He hath put down the mighty from *their* seats, and exalted them of low degree.
- ⁵³ He hath filled the hungry with good things; and the rich he hath sent empty away.
- ⁵⁴ He hath holpen his servant Israel,

in remembrance of *his* mercy;
